#### **Directions**

NNMC lies on the Maryland side of the Capital Beltway (I-495) in Montgomery County. The Beltway is accessed from the north on Interstate 95 or the Baltimore-Washington Parkway, from the east on MD Rt. 50, from southern MD on MD Rt. 4 or 5, from all points south on Interstate 95, and from the west on Interstate 66. Head west on the Capital Beltway. Take Exit 34, Rt. 355, South, Wisconsin Ave. towards Bethesda, in left lane. Cross Cedar Lane; at first median crossing (no light), turn left into the National Naval Medical Center. At the guard station, show ID. Park in the America Garage. After walking across from the America garage to the America building entrance walk past the information desk and take the bank of elevators on the right to the 4th floor. Turn right out of the elevator and walk past the pediatrics waiting room to the Canyon conference room on the left.



2. The big model engineering and machining show *Cabin Fever Expo*, previously held in mid-January in York, PA, has moved its dates to mid-April. This year it's 13 and 14 April, still at York. Even if you're not in to this sort of modeling, it's worth a trip just to see what the other guys are doing: scratch building on steroids. Also some simply weird commercial products, like an internal combustion pogo stick from the 1950s. (Display only. No one was suicidal enough to try it.) My personal favorites were some model airplane motors with a 2mm bore and 3mm stroke that ran on CO<sub>2</sub>, and a collection of models of stationary steam engines made of wood (ran on compressed air). There was a large indoor pond for working ship models: live steam, electric, fuel, and submarine. Also a good place to pick up odd parts and accessories for your home shop tools.
