



UPCOMING EVENT HIGHLIGHTS & PLANNING INFORMATION

Naval Surface Warfare Center, Carderock Division (Previously the David Taylor Research Center) Visit 20 August

This is one not to miss! Kudos and thanks to Dana Wegner who, as a NSWC employee coordinated the visit for us! Ms. Jennifer Brewster (301) 227-1176 will be leading the general tour of the base facilities. The tour is scheduled to last from 1000 to 1300. This should help with avoiding morning rush hour traffic and competing with the Center's work force all trying to get through the gate. We have invited both the Philadelphia Ship Model Society (PSMS) and the Annapolis modelers to join us. Two from PSMS have signed up and possibly a few more will as we get closer. So far, we have not heard from the Annapolis crowd. The first half of the visit will be touring some of the unique facilities such as the model basin. The second half we will be visiting with Dana Wegner who is the center's curator of ship models. he will take us on an inside tour of their enormous model storage and maintenance areas as well as provide us an overview of the Navy's long and sometimes checkered past of overseeing the Navy's historical collection.

If you are trying to find "David Taylor" on a map or using GPS it now appears as the Naval Surface Warfare Center, Carderock Division on all of the local maps and the web. Also, using GPS will send you to the truck entrance at 9500 MacArthur Boulevard. Visitors cannot enter via the truck entrance and the guards there will send you around to the visitor's entrance on Clara



Barton Parkway. The visitor's entrance is the only exit on Clara Barton between the Beltway (Exit 41) and MacArthur Blvd.

National Capital Model Soldier's Society (NCMSS) 53rd Annual Show

The show will be held Saturday, September 13, 2014 at Thomas Edison High School in Alexandria. NMCMSS is a membership supported club for military miniatures hobbyist. It like the WSMS provides members with a means to exchange ideas, information and reference materials. They hold monthly meetings, sponsor regular painting clinics, publish a monthly newsletter and host this major annual regional military miniatures exhibition. The show is principally organized for Figure painters as well as collectors of miniature figures, toy soldiers, plastic models and militaria, however as our shipbuilding hobby can include ship's crews, figureheads, etc, and shares the need for similar modeling and painting skills we have become a significant part of this show. It is also where we have recruited more than a few people to become WSMS members as well.

Eastern Shore Waterman Working Craft & Shipyard Visit

This is event is still in the early planning stages but should occur sometime this fall. We are working with Mr. Ed Somers, a fellow ship modeler who specializes in Chesapeake Bay working boats. Ed is from a long lineage of Eastern Shore waterman and skippers a research vessel for the state of Maryland. He is still developing his thoughts on the visit but but the idea he is cogitating on providing an overview on watercraft associated with Crisfield, Smith Island, and the Tangier area. This will probably be worked in coordination with the Crisfield Heritage Foundation. If enough people in are interested, we may be able to have a boat builder, Mickey Parks, give us a presentation of how he would set one of those boats up by eye. Watch here for more information as the bridge team works the idea with Ed.

1st Annual Mid-Atlantic Ship Model Conference & Show

We in partnership with the Philadelphia Ship Model Society (PSMS) are planning to host a regional ship model conference in 2015. We have entered into a contract with the Conference Center at The

Maritime Institute (CCMIT) to as the location for the event. on Saturday, 6-13-15. If the conference would go into a second day (6-14-15), there would be events scheduled away from CCMIT. At this point no one "really" knows how many people will be attending. the conference. However, I would lower the projected attendees to 80-100 people.


Imperial German Navy ship floats over Africa in 1917!

And now the 22 inch model of L.59 floats over Carl's workshop!

Strange But True! We tend t forget that Germany had 4 colonies in 1914. Those colonies had military contingents that fought the Allies in Africa. The German colonial army of Colonel Paul Emil von Lettow-Vorbeck conducted a guerilla campaign right through until the armistice. It however needed supplies, and the

German Navy had a solution.

The model is a paper one, made from the Polish JSC Mikroflota kit in 1:400 scale. Interestingly L.59 had the flags or insignia of the Central Powers painted over it as it was to fly over Austria Hungry,

Union. Only a few of the vessels were commissioned in the US Navy for convoy duty. The adventures of the British Navy corvettes have been documented in the movie The Cruel Sea
